# **GREAT LENT 2014**

Great Lent is the 50-day season of spiritual preparation that comes before the most important Feast - Holy Easter. This annual season of repentance is a spiritual journey with our Savior. During Great Lent, the Church teaches us how to receive our Lord Jesus Christ by using the two great means of repentance— prayer and fasting.

#### March 2nd – Sunday of Cana

#### March 3rd – Monday Great Lent Starts


The Church, begins Great Lent with the 'Day of Forgiveness,' and sets her journey into penitence. The service of reconciliation is conducted on Monday, the first day if the Great Lent, at the end of third hour. The Service of Reconciliation or shubgono, stands at the 'threshold of Great Lent.

March 8<sup>th</sup> - The Forty Holy Martyrs of Sebastia were martyred in approximately 320 AD.

- March 9<sup>th</sup> Sunday 40 Martyrs of Sebaste and , Garbo (Leper)
- March 16th Sunday M'Shario (Paralytic)
- March 23rd Sunday Knanaitho (Cananite Woman)

#### March 25 - Suboro (Annunciation to the Virgin St. Mary)

Annunciation to the Virgin is one of the most important feasts in the Malankara Orthodox Church, so important that the Holy Qurbana must be held on this day even if March 25th also happens to be Good Friday! (The Holy Liturgy is otherwise prohibited on Good Friday since the Church celebrates the death of Christ; in fact, the altar is stripped of all altar vessels and covered in black on Good Friday.)



#### Mid-Lent -March 26 Wednesday

The 25th day of the lent, which is always a Wednesday, is known as mid lent. This is one of the very few days during the great lent when the Holy Qurbana is celebrated on a weekday other than Sunday or Saturday



On this day, there is a procession

around the church carrying the cross. This is followed by an exaltation of the cross (Sleeba Aaghosham) facing the four directions; East, West, North, and South. Then the cross is placed on a big decorated cross like stand covered with a red cloth (Golgotha) in the middle of the church. This remains in the church until the Feast of Ascension of our Lord, which occurs 40 days after the Kyomtha (Feast of the Resurrection or otherwise known as Easter).

#### March 30<sup>th</sup> – Sunday Kpiptho (Cripple Woman)

April 6<sup>th</sup> – Sunday - Samiyo (Blind Man), Catholicate Day April 11 – 40th day of Lent

April 12 - Lazarus Saturday – We celebrate the supernatural wonder of our Lord raising LAzrus from the dead.

#### April 13 – Ushana [Palm Sunday]

On Sunday, five days before the day of Passover, the Lord came from Bethany to Jerusalem. Sending two of His disciples to bring Him a donkey., He sat thereon and entered into the city. When the multitude there heard that Jesus was coming, they straightway took up the branches of palm trees in their hands, and went forth to meet Him. Others spread their garments on the ground, and yet others cut branches from the trees and strewed them in the way that Jesus was to pass; and all of them together, especially the children, went before and after Him, crying out: "Hosanna: Blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord, the King of Israel" (John 12:13).

#### **April 17 - Holy Thursday**

On the evening of this day, which was the eve of the feast of unleavened bread (that is, the Passover), our Lord Jesus Christ had supper with His twelve disciples. He blessed the bread and the wine, and gave us the Mystery of the Divine Eucharist. He washed the feet of the disciples as an example of humility.

#### April 18 - Good Friday

Jesus Christ was sent bound from Caiaphas to Pontius Pilate, who was then Governor of Judea. Pilate interrogated Him in many ways, and once and again acknowledged that He was innocent, but to please the Jews, he later passed the sentence of death against Him. After scourging the Lord of all as though He were a runaway slave, he surrendered Him to be crucified.

#### April 19 - Holy Saturday

On Saturday, the high priests and Pharisees gathered together before Pilate and asked him to have Jesus' tomb sealed until the third day. While commemorating the entombment of the holy Body of our Lord, we also celebrate His dread descent with His soul, whereby He destroyed the gates and bars of Hades, and made His light to shine where only darkness had reigned (Job 3 8 : 17; Isaiah 49:9; 1 Peter 3:18-20); death was put to death, Hades was stripped of all its captives, our first parents and all the righteous who died from the beginning of time ran to Him Whom they had awaited, and the holy angelic orders glorified God for the restoration of our fallen race.

#### April 20 - Qyomto (Easter)

Mary Magdalene, and the other women who were present at the burial of our Savior on Friday evening, returned from Golgotha to the city and prepared fragrant spices and myrrh, so that they might anoint the body of Jesus. On the morrow, because of the law which forbids work on the day of the Sabbath, they rested for the whole day. But at early dawn on the Sunday that followed, almost thirty-six hours since the death of the Life-giving Redeemer, they came to the sepulchre with the spices to anoint His body. While they were considering the difficulty of rolling away the stone from the door of the sepulchre, there was a fearful earthquake; and an Angel, whose countenance shone like lightning and whose garment was white as snow, rolled away the stone and sat upon it. The guards that were there became as dead from fear and took to flight. The women, however, went into the sepulchre, but did not find the Lord's body. Instead, they saw two other Angels in the form of youths clothed in white, who told them that the Savior was risen, and they sent forth the women, who ran to proclaim to the disciples these gladsome tidings. Then Peter and John arrived, having learned from Mary Magdalene what had come to pass, and when they entered the tomb, they found only the winding sheets. Therefore, they returned again to the city with joy, as heralds now of the supernatural Resurrection of Christ, Who in truth was seen alive by the disciples on this day on five occasions.

#### May 29 - Sulogo (Ascension)

After forty days after His Resurrection from the dead, our Lord Jesus Christ led the disciples to the Mount of Olives and ascended in glory into Heaven.

#### June 8 - Pentecost

On this day we recall that just 50 days after the Glorious Resurrection and 10 days after the Victorious Ascension of our Lord, the Holy Spirit came upon the Holy Apostles and all those gathered. We celebrate the bringing of the Holy Spirit, Pentecost.

# "Parumala Thirumeni"

Parumala Thirumeni led an ascetic life at Parumala Syrían Semínary. He woke up at 4 a.m in the morning and prayed till 5 a.m. He taught deacons till Fa.m followed by prayer and a light breakfast. From 9am till 11am he taught deacons again. From 11am to noon he took care of administrative matters and again went to pray at noon, followed by lunch. He rested till 1:30pm and taught till 4pm with a brief prayer in between. From 4pm to 5:30pm he was busy with his administrative duties; vespers, bath and a stroll up and down the church yard; supper and lessons in tune - they would all sit by a lantern. After evening prayers and supper, he taught the Bible to the deacons. He would let the deacons go to bed at 9pm, but he would still be praying until midnight. On Wednesdays and Fridays and Lenten days, he would fast till evening besides observing his own special fasts. His faith in the power of prayer which was molded in his childhood itself, is expressed in his own words : "Far greater things are wrought by prayer than what you can ever dream of."





Translation of MATHOPADESHA SARANGAL by St Geevarghese Mar Dionvysius.

"It is highly essential that htose who belong to a religion should learn the faith and precepts of that religion."

### ABOUT THE HOLY TRINITY

(1) There is only one God, who is life abd truth, the creator of everything visible and invisible.
(2) These is no other God than the One God, who is the original cause of everything. (3) He is without beginning and is eternal. (4) He is omcorporea and cannot be seen by eyes of the flesh, and is omnipotent. (5) omniscient. (6) omnipresent. (7) perfect in goodness (8) inconceivable.
(9) is without change. (10) and is ruler of everything. (11) There are three personalities in Godhead – the Father, son and the Holy Spirit. (12) That is, one in three and three in one.
Between the three persons there is not variation as regards seniority, stature or strength. They have one essence, one kingship, one nature, one will, one thinking, one power, one glory and one leadership.



Moral : Deed of kindness never become fruitless.






# What is God's will?
